Group to elect officers at next meeting !!!!

A scheduled meeting was held in the Dillenbach room at Flower Memorial Library Aug. 8th at 7:30.

In attendance were, Maurice Herron of Belleville, Gus Rogers of Clayton, Mary Lou McCreadie of Adams, Helen McDonald of Alexandria Bay, Ellen & John Bartlett of Syracuse.

John Bartlett acting as temporary secretary read the minutes of the meeting on July 20 at Perkins when Pat James addressed us.

The members present held an informal meeting expressing our individual expectations of what we hoped our new organization could accomplish.

Mary Lou McCreadie mentioned that we could use the help from someone who was good at PR work.

Maurice Herron said that he felt that our Organization name did not really describe what our groups' interest was which is Genealogy. Others agreed that what we don't need is another Historical Association.

Mary Lou McCreadie asked what the group thought about including Lewis and Oswego county people in our association. Helen McDonald said that to the best of her knowledge those counties did not have an ongoing newsletter and that inviting them into our group now would be better than later and that there probably would be

many interested people from those counties.

Maurice Herron, who is President of the Jefferson County Cemetery Association has helped four other organizations in setting up as a Non Profit Organizations and said he would be willing to advise in that area.

John Bartlett will type up a preliminary constitution and by laws for submission to the group at the next meeting.

The group as a whole feels that we should more clearly define our purpose. One of the suggestions was to find out where each piece of genealogical data was for Jefferson county and to produce a list which would be published in our newsletter. This would help all researchers near and far.

Ellen and John Bartlett thought that we should ask for names of people who do research in the county, we then could publish this list of names so that our members who do not live in the area would have the names of local researchers they could contact.

Mary Lou McCreadie said that she could get out notification of our existence by getting some flyers to the North Country Library System.

At this years meeting Pat looked a little tired but who wouldn't be flying {continued page 2 col. 1}

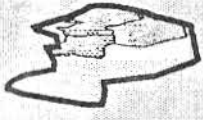

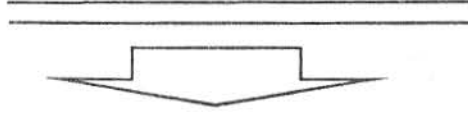

**REAL DAUGHTER OF THE REVOLUTION
AGED 102**

WATERTOWN DAILY TIMES 1900

Five Generations Gather at Cape Vincent, on the St. Lawrence River, to Do Honor to Mrs. David Burnett.

Her Father Fought Under Washington for the Independence of His Country — Descended from John Alden

The oldest child of a soldier of the Revolution surviving in the State of New York celebrated yesterday her one hundred and second birthday.

She is Mrs. David Burnett, (editors note: her name was Asenath Moseley.) and at the old family homestead, at Cape Vincent, on the St. Lawrence River, representatives of five generations of the old lady's descendants gathered to do her honor.

Mrs. Burnett is the daughter of Uriah Moseley, who fought gallantly under Washington for the independence of his country. Her husband was David Burnett, a member of a distinguished Connecticut family who died at Cape Vincent twenty-five years ago after a happy married life of more than half a century.

The venerable lady has also the honor of being the sixth in direct line of descent from John Alden and his wife, Priscilla, who came over in the Mayflower, and among her more cherished possessions are two pieces of rude crockery ware which they brought from the mother country with them and a tattered fragment of the tent under which they first found shelter after landing on the shores of New England.

Two of Mrs. Burnett's children are now living at a very advanced age. They are N.M. Burnett, a prominent citizen of Cape Vincent, and Mrs. Cornelia Parker, of Watertown, N.Y.

She has ten grandchildren, Thirteen great-grandchildren and thirteen great-great-grandchildren.

Among the grandchildren are Dr. C.B. Parker and Dr. D.L. Parker, of No. 167 Remsen street, and Dr. V.F. Parker, of No. 124 Montague street, Brooklyn.

Joanne Rusho, Senior Clerk advised me that most of the records are available, though some are sealed. Copy fee is \$1.00 per printed page. They do not do searches but are willing to assist you.

Surrogate's Court

Located on the 7th floor, this office will do searches, however the charges are rather steep. \$25.00 for anything up to 25 years ago, \$75.00 for anything older. You pay even if they do not find anything and the charges are per person searched. Copies are \$.25 each or if you want them certified the cost will be \$5.00 per page. Probably it would be more cost effective to have a local researcher do this work for you if you can't do it yourself.

Jefferson County NY Genealogical Informer will be published six times per year. All members may submit Queries at no charge. A charge of \$2.00 per query will charged for non-members. Members are encouraged to submit genealogical materials to the Informer for publication in future issues.

WAR OF 1812

This information was found on page 560 , 561 in "History Of Jefferson County,New York".

"The following list shows, from the "Index of Awards" published from the office of the Adjutant-General of the State of New York, the names of the Soldiers of the War of 1812-15 who were living in Jefferson County as late as 1859-60. These do not include all who served, nor is it possible to secure a complete list, as many participated less than sixty days in the second struggle with England, and were not entitled to pensions; consequently their names do not appear. The post-office addresses at the times the awards were made are given in the volume, and

as many have removed from the county, this is another reason why the list cannot be made complete".

The first burial plot in the Town of Lyme was located near the spring at old Town Springs. Timothy Soper, the first one buried in Lyme is buried there, others too. I don't know where it is and have no records.

On the town lines of Brownville and Clayton, near Reynolds Corners was a burial plot with enough graves to be noted on the 1855 and 1892 maps. Nothing remains today and nobody I talk to remembers it. It was not in the DAR records, so probably the stones were gone by 1915. It is believed they were taken away by a farmer to clear the land for crops. There were probably LaRoses' buried there.

The Late MRS.SUSAN HURD COOK
Centenarian Member of The D.A.R. Who Died At Clayton
Recently

Susan Hurd Cook, one of the few remaining real Daughters of the American Revolution, died November 3 at home in Clayton on the St.Lawrence River, in her 103d year. She was a member of LeRay Chaumont Chapter, D.A.R., of Watertown, and was probably the oldest one in the country.

Mrs.Cook was born in Bennington county, VT., May 14, 1808. Her father, Q.Hurd, enlisted at Plainfield, Conn., for eight months in the Continental army.

The year following he re-enlisted for another year, subsequently re-enlisting again and serving up to within a few months of the close of the revolution. He moved to Jefferson county, N.Y., in 1812 and died at Watertown in 1852, at the age of 97. Burial was made in the old Arsenal Street Cemetery of that city.

The daughter who has just passed away was married to Hial Cook, of Clayton, who died 20 years ago. Mrs.Cook was about 100 years old when she became a member of the D.A.R. making the necessary steps at the request of Mrs.Charles A.Ellis, of Clayton. When she received her certificate from the pension department she was presented with a gold spoon bearing the membership number 59,420. The past two years it had been the custom of the local chapter to visit Mrs.Cook on her birthday and present her with carnations, one for every year of her age. She had been in poor health since she suffered a stroke four years ago. She fell and broke her hip last spring and after that began to fall considerably. Four days before her death she lapsed into unconsciousness. Her nearest surviving relative is a nephew, James Ward Hurd, of Watertown. The funeral was largely attended at her home Sunday, many members of the D.A.R. being present. Rev.E.E. Cheesman, of the Clayton Methodist Church, officiated. Burial was made in a local cemetery.

TIMOTHY GREENLEY OF RODMAN JEFFERSON COUNTY, NEW YORK

Timothy GREENLEY left Glastonbury, CT. as a young man of 22. He is descended from the GOSLEES who were prominent land holders in Glastonbury. He migrated first to the newly established township of Litchfield, Herkimer Co., NY in about 1790 and this is where he met and married Ruth the daughter of Solomon and Ruth KELLOGG on 29MAR1792. Timothy and Ruth are listed as being from Whitestown in land records.

Timothy set out for the Promised Land in Black River Country in 1802 traveling by the Indian Trail. Tired of his way, he is purported to have purchased the first lands he found, buying 2,663 acres in the Town of Rodman, the largest single purchase by a settler, (Coughlin's Jefferson County Centennial of 1905). Many of his friends and neighbors from Litchfield came later to settle Rodman and Worth in 1803. It was a very difficult trip on wood trails as there were no roads to follow at this time. The major form of transportation was a drag formed from the crotch of a tree and drawn by oxen.

Jefferson County History by Durant and Pierce states that the first school was housed in Timothy Greenley's house in Rodman, near the "Corners".

Timothy and Ruth Greenley had sons Francis, James, Orasmus, Solomon K., George, Albert and Robert, daughters Amanda, Lucy Ann, and Sophia (my ancestor who married Lorenzo GLASS). Ruth died 27MAR1813 and Timothy's second wife Sally died 2APR1837 age 56. They are buried on either side of Timothy in Fairview Cemetery in Rodman. Timothy died at the age of 84 on 19FEB1852 leaving a will listing an inventory worth \$22,540.26.

Timothy Greenley is an example of how surnames were changed throughout early American history. Child's history of Jefferson Co., tells that the original Greenley name was really STONE. The names designated them

Desiring to come to America, (mechanics were prohibited from coming to America at that time) they assumed the name of GASSELEE and afterwards GREELEE. This corresponds to a family story told by Evelyn GLASS KIEUCHLE of Fort Lauderdale, Florida of a relative coming to visit but leaving in disgust because the family name had been changed. We have not found the reason for Timothy and brother Thomas who emigrated to Herkimer and Madison Co. changing the name to Greenley.

TIMOTHY GREENLEY's will was recorded in the Jefferson County Surrogate's Court on 19FEB1852. This is also the date of death that appears on his tombstone in Fairview Cemetery, Rodman, NY. Ora Cooley was the executor of the will. He is the husband of Timothy's daughter, Amanda, who was deceased. The will lists son, Francis, as deceased, leaving sons James of full age and William and Orasmus, minors living somewhere in the state of Indiana. Listed next are Alfred G. Cooley of age of Jefferson Co., Wisconsin, Emily R. Adams, wife of Hubbard Adams of Clarkson, Monroe Co., NY, Charlotte and Nelson West, minors of Oswego Co., NY and Delos Cooley, minor of Rodman, NY. Also listed are Solomon K. Greenley of Rodman, George Greenley of New York City, Lucy Ann Loomis wife of Milo of New York City and Robert Greenley, Rodman, NY.

Legacies were also left to James Willet, son of grandson Philo of New York City and Mary Thompson, wife of Cephus Thompson of Rodman. Also, the children of Electa Root, a deceased granddaughter, living in Upper Canada received a legacy.

Author's note: We have not found the reason for Timothy and his brother Thomas' reason for changing the name to Greenley.
